The MFF member countries have established a Regional Steering Committee, and each member country has also set up a National Coordinating Body (NCB). In Indonesia, Ministry of National Development Planning/National Development Planning Agency (BAPPENAS) is the focal point of MFF Indonesia as well as the Chairman of NCB Indonesia. Indonesia's NCB consists of Ministry of Marine Affairs and Fisheries (MMAF), Ministry of Environment and Forestry (MoEF), Ministry of Home Affairs (MoHA), United Nation Development Program (UNDP), Wetlands International Indonesia (WII) and a mangrove expert.

Participation in International Mangrove Conference in Bali, 2017 organised by Ministry of Environment and Forestry (MoEF). Participants comprised representatives from 19 countries of Asia Pacific, Africa and Latin America, various stakeholders that include policy makers, researchers, academia, civil society organisations, and private sectors.

Training on Mangroves-Carbon Counting in August 2017 to enhance capacity of stakeholders including government, NGOs and others in measuring and counting carbon in mangroves forest. The attendees comprised 37 representatives from government, NGOs and Universities.
